This year, North Oaks Health System proudly commemorates 65 years of service to the residents of the Florida Parishes—a milestone that reflects its longevity and steadfast commitment to the health and well-being of our community.

When the ambulance transporting resident Mary Antin and her injured, feverish six-year-old son Bud to the nearest hospital in New Orleans waited in traffic for the Manchac drawbridge to close, the need for a local acute care hospital became apparent. The experience sparked a tremendous community movement that led to the opening of Seventh Ward General Hospital in 1960, laying the foundation of what would become North Oaks Health System.

From a small hospital built on a donated strawberry field, we have evolved into a comprehensive regional health system with a footprint spanning 191 acres. Our health system now features two hospitals, more than 44 medical practices, a radiologic technology school, a dietetic internship and a newly launched, accredited Graduate Medical Education program.

As we reflect on 65 years of progress, we remain focused on the future. We aim to continue building a health system that meets today's needs and anticipates tomorrow's challenges with compassion, excellence and community partnership.
























































GME INTERNAL MEDICINE RESIDENCY PROGRAM

North Oaks GME launched its Transitional Year Residency Program at North Oaks Medical Center, appointing Dr. Abir Abdo as Program Director in March 2025. The transitional year residency is a one-year program designed for medical graduates seeking broad clinical training experience before pursuing specialty residency or further training.

The transitional year program matched eight residents from five states and three countries for the 2025 academic year. These transitional year residents gain experience through rotations in key medical specialties such as cardiovascular disease, emergency medicine, general surgery, gerontology, internal medicine and urgent care.

North Oaks GME appointed Dr. John Wuthrich as the Internal Medicine Residency Program Director in November 2024 to lead its curriculum development, resident training and faculty advancement. The internal medicine program also matched its second class of nine residents for the 2025 academic year.

Established in 2024, North Oaks GME supports the health system's long-term strategy to address physician shortages—especially in primary care medicine—and strengthen both healthcare access and outcomes across the Northshore region. The program is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) and provides hands-on training at North Oaks facilities under the guidance of experienced physicians.

The residencies supported by North Oaks GME are projected to train approximately 48 residents each year once fully implemented by 2030.

NORTH OAKS WON GHX SUPPLY CHAINS OF DISTINCTION AWARD



Construction continued on the approximately \$50 million North Oaks Clinic Building 3, a five-story, 95,809-square-foot facility designed to expand access to specialty care and support future healthcare services growth. Upon completion, the building will house 12 clinics with 115 exam rooms, 47 offices and 13 nurses' stations. It will also feature a coffee shop and covered walkways connecting it to other North Oaks facilities, improving convenience and comfort for patients and staff. The expansion reflects North Oaks' commitment to meeting regional healthcare needs and enhancing patient access to high-quality care.


